To begin fulfilling that calling, she graduated from Kentucky Mountain Bible College in 2009 and went on to



start Miss Tara Ministries. Miss Tara Ministries has been doing original VBS programs in local churches for five years. Miss Tara currently continues to work as a schoolteacher and in her local church with the children and youth. She strives to live everyday according to Colossians 3:23, "Work willingly at whatever you do, as though you were working for the Lord rather than for people."



Meet Nelson Perdue

Dr. Nelson Perdue is a tenured evangelist in the Church of the Nazarene having served full-time since 1974. His ministry has taken him to four continents of the world. He is a faithful exponent of the message of scriptural holiness. He formerly served as the Revivalism Coordinator for the Church of the Nazarene. He is the founder and former executive editor of the periodical, **The Evangelists' Perspective**, and has authored a booklet entitled **Holiness: Our Heritage**. Dr. Perdue's second book, **The School of Christ**, is a compilation of 12 holiness expositions and was published in March 2006. He has also written a study on sanctification entitled **Holiness Horizons: A Purview of Sanctification**. This book was released in April 2007. The most recent book published by Dr. Perdue was written in 2010 and is entitled **The Beauty of Holiness**.

Meet Billy Huddleston:

Rev. Billy Huddleston is an ordained elder and a tenured evangelist in the Church of the Nazarene. (This means he does what he does fulltime and is committed to continuing in evangelistic ministry until he grows hair again or the Lord returns.) He's an alumnus of Olivet Nazarene University, Kankakee, Ill. During his time there he was a four year member of the Orpheus Choir, participated in the spiritual life program, held revivals and youth revivals across the educational region and sang with the southern gospel quartet United. Billy's music is played nationally on Southern Gospel Radio. Billy has appeared in the Christian Voice and Singing News magazines—as well as charting on the Singing News National Top 80 Southern Gospel Chart.

Tamla, his wife, is also a musician and contributes greatly to ministry through the keyboards and singing. Her passion is to see people saved and sanctified and grow in grace. Her devotion is evident through her tender spirit and deep surrender.

They have a number of musical projects to extend their ministry beyond the walls of the church. Ministry in many world areas has expanded their overall effectiveness in personalizing the gospel to many cultures and customs. They are in demand in a variety of settings and carry a burden to see God's Church revived in this day of nominal-ism. Their spirit is contagious and their message is pertinent.

The Leckrones' involvement with all ages emphasizes the great need for renewal in everyone. Their thirst for the Word and desire to proclaim the need for holy living helps others to catch a glimpse of the process and adventure in serving God through a surrendered life.
