CELEBRATING MS. LORINE OMAN – Born 10/29/1918



When did you start going to Portage Holiness Camp? When I was a little girl. My mother would go and stay in a building that is not there anymore. I was the youngest of the girls so I would get to go with my mother and stay the 10 days. We also would stay in my Grandfather's (Sherman Parker) cottage, which had a cooking stove in it. I had cousins that also stayed. My mother also grew up going to Portage Holiness Camp.

What do you remember about those days? We had rain showers then too. Mother always had a big garden at home and she would bring up produce to the Kitchen for the cooks to use during camp.

When did you start making cookies for the camp to enjoy? I don't remember. I always brought cookies when I was growing up and could make them. Mother encouraged me to learn how to bake so we could bring the cookies to Portage.

Tell me about your cottage? My two sisters and I bought this cottage. My

mother would also stay so we had all 4 of us staying in it for camp. Dad wouldn't go to Portage to stay because he had a farm to take care of. Dad would always take mother down to clean the cottage though.

Tell me about your teaching days? went to Findlay College and mother went with me. We explained that we didn't have any money. Mother and I went into the President of the college and said that we didn't have any money but that I needed an education. The President said that my dad had a farm and they could get the money from that. I explained that my dad wouldn't approve of using the farm. I had earned some money and saved it but it was not enough. So, the President said that would do and he gave me a job in his home. The President and his wife had 3 children (a girl and 2 boys). I would take care of the youngest boy and get him ready for supper. I was not the main cook but I still had certain things that I cooked for them. I made Lemon pies, cookies and sandwiches for them. The President also had boys from the college do the cleaning. However, I would go after the boys and clean certain things the way the President's wife wanted it done. The boys that worked there would run the sweeper. I usually did the dusting and follow them to do it. The President's staff didn't do the cleaning - the college students did. I also ironed the President's shirts. He liked how I pressed them better than how his wife would press the shirts. The President and family were always nice to me.

After I graduated, my first teaching job was in Paulding County at Haviland. I taught Jr. High and Sr. High grades for 3 years. Then I switched to Arlington School and

taught High School English for 1 year. The Vanlue Superintendent came out to see me at my parent's farm. He said that He didn't think it was right that I was teaching at Arlington when Vanlue needs me. The Superintendent talked me into leaving Arlington Schools. I had graduated from Vanlue so that is why I went back. When I told Arlington School – they said that wasn't fair – we need a High School English teacher too. However, I left and started teaching High School English. Then I became the Principle of the High School for 15 years. I had a good Superintendent above me. He would always back me up with what I had told the kids. I would also take the classes to lunch and back. The kids didn't make a miss-move if I was there.

Tell us how you found Jesus? My mother always took me to camp meeting. The camp had Children's Church and Teen's back then too. I went to the alter during one of those camp meetings when I was a teen in High School. I had to make up my mind to be a Christian and have never regretted it.

What are your favorite memories of Portage Holiness Camp? I enjoy the Ministers that come and preach and sing. I still enjoy them. I have really enjoyed the last few years because I have heard them in Florida at Lakeland Camp that I go to in the winter.

What do you want for the future of Portage Holiness Camp? I would like to see it go on just like it is. We have a good camp!
