I don't know about everyone else who attended campmeeting 2014 but as for me I found quite a blessing there this year. Yes, I know, the emotional charges that came in August come and go. But, as I remember the specific workings of the Lord in my own life and in the testimonies of those who shared I have an anchor that cannot be moved. I know in my heart that God is alive; He is active in our lives; He provides for us; He shelters us; He works out the major and the minor details in an amazing display of his loving kindness. That doesn't mean we are without trials but it does mean that we do not walk through the valley and the shadow of death and evil alone. He is with us. Every day since camp I have found Him faithful to His Word. In camp business this past September the board passed three motions regarding cottage owner guidelines. A motion was made to add the following beginning in 2015, "Cottage owners must sign current cottage owner's guidelines each year and return to the Board Secretary. Failure to do so, the cabin will revert back to the camp board."

Also, a motion to rewrite guideline # 5 as: "Utility fee for cottages will be \$30 per camp or \$50 per camp with air conditions."

And also guideline #9 is changed to read: "A cottage owner that comes to camp for work, recreation

or etc. the fees will be \$3. per night or \$5 per night with air."

As was mentioned during camp we need to be working on getting our electrical works upgraded. We want to start with adding weather heads to the places where the lines enter the buildings. Then go to restrooms, dorms and Tabernacle. Cottage lines will need to be the responsibility of each individual cottage owner. All of this at once would put us into debt so the board agreed that when money comes available we will begin the work. In a few cases we think that it might be cheaper in the short-term and long-term to lay some of the lines underground. If this is the case and we have the funds we would like to begin trenching some of the lines this spring.

During the board meeting it was learned that there might have been people that would have attended more of camp if they had a place to stay. The board discussed this issue but decided that the Cottage Owner's guidelines already addresses this issue and people should just be reminded. Guideline #2 says:

"2. It is expected that cottage owners and other campers attend as many of the camp's services as possible. Your cottage is not intended to be a summer home. If you are unable to use your cottage in any given camp time please rent it out, or notify the camp leadership so that arrangements can be made to let others use your cottage."

Basically that just means if you can't be to camp try to find someone else who could benefit from your cottage. If you are unable to find someone please contact one of the officers or trustees of the camp for suggestions. We usually have a waiting list of people who would like to come.

Another topic of discussion was upkeep of buildings as addressed in Guideline #3, "It is expected that you carry your own insurance on your buildings and contents and that you have in your cottage a smoke alarm and a fire extinguisher. It is expected that your cottage be kept in good repair and that after camp you will put away or move all personal possessions from around your cabin."

Children's Meeting at Portage Holiness Camp

If you attended Children's Meeting at PHC in 2001 you might be as old 24 years old now. You would have had Miss Barb Deaton, from KBMC as your teacher. For 14 vears she faithfully taught our children from the Word of God, plainly showing them the way of Salvation through Jesus Christ, and how to walk a sanctified life totally sold out and committed to God our Creator.

In 2015 she has asked that we find a replacement for her. She recommended one of her former students Miss Tara Parson. Jonathan White found a deep love for singing at an early age. He has been singing since before he can remember. His mom and dad would stand him up in the front of the Church and have him sing with his brothers and



later his sister. Jonathan's father was a pastor, and eventually, he became an evangelist. Jonathan would sing along with his siblings and parents, and later in the service, his father would preach. Those first several years were important in developing a heart for ministry in Jonathan. The seeds were planted, though Jonathan never pursued any kind of professional career in music until later in life. In 1991, Jonathan was married to Sheila. However, despite this happy time in his life, tragedy soon struck his family. Nine months after he was married, May 16, 1992 to be exact, a drunk driver ran a red light going 90 MPH and hit his parent's car. His father died instantly, and his mother lived for 16 days in the hospital before she went home to Heaven. Despite having only been married nine months, Jonathan and his wife Sheila took on a new role, as both his 10 year old sister and 16 year old brother were now under their care. This was a tremendous burden on a new marriage. However, they learned that with God all things are possible, and though it was not what they had planned, they learned to find the "silver lining" and learned what Trusting God was all about. It was amazing to watch the Lord take care of them during this time.

Jonathan has had the opportunity to sing for many different kinds of audiences. From the Grand Ole Opry, to the Bill Gaither Homecoming Concert Series, to the little church down the street. Jonathan is willing to sing for God just about anywhere to any size crowd. He has learned, it's not about the size of a crowd, it's about ministering to each individual that has come to the concert. He gives the same emotion and heart regardless of who or how many are there. It's all about reaching others for Christ. Pastor Mark Ralph, of the Mt. Zion UB church, was hospitalized briefly in November. We praise the Lord for a quick recovery.


